February 15 – Classical Kickoff

We will attend a Detroit Symphony Orchestra mid-morning concert featuring “Appalachia Spring” by Copeland; we have excellent, ground floor seats. Then we’ll stop by Slow’s Barbeque for lunch. (\$68)

March 21 – Time for a Cookoff

We’ll have an exclusive opportunity to participate in the Mirepoix Cooking School at the Holiday Market, Royal Oak. Supervised by professional chefs, we’ll be divided into groups to “duel” against each other in preparing a meal; then we’ll enjoy our creations. Opportunity to shop in this unique market. (\$77)
